

OD of the Year

Dr. David McBride, OD

Portland, Or



Whether sitting behind his desk in a tiny, crowded office or trying to enjoy a bite of lunch while "Zooming" from his kitchen, Dr. David McBride dedicated a huge share of his "off-hours" during the past year establishing, then managing a keyperson network to advocate for expanded scope of practice legislation. For the last 3 years, Dr. McBride participated on the Legislative committee developing the keyperson network. Oregon's keyperson database currently hosts more than 400 contacts. In addition to overseeing those herculean tasks, he also oversaw solicitation development and management of Oregon Optometric Public Affairs (OOPAC) activities. Contributions to OOPAC are made to legislative campaigns and candidates that support optometry and its role as primary eye-care providers. An AOA/OOPA member since 1981, he serves as OOPAC and OOPA Keyperson Chair. Dr. McBride not only donates his time and expertise, but he also gives personally. He is a Legacy member of OOPA

and a Presidential donor for AOA PAC. He is also a regular supporter and donor to the Oregon Lions Foundation, Optometry Giving Sight, and Vison Source Foundation.

In the last year, Dr. McBride participated in a wide range of meetings with the American Optometric Association (AOA) - State Government Relations Committee, Advocacy Executive Committee, and all Advocacy Committee meetings. His leadership is even more notable when considering the wave of challenges that he and his staff faced through the pandemic. A 20-year member of Vision Source, he now serves as co-administrator for Oregon. Dr. McBride is a regular contributor to national advocacy efforts and has participated in countless "AOA on Capitol Hill" events – both virtually an in-person. He directly connects with elected officials and staff on community, state, and national levels.

Lifetime Achievement Award

Dr. Thomas W. Theune, OD

Colorado Springs, CO



When Thomas W. Theune graduated from the Indiana University School of Optometry in 1985, he was looking forward to a career serving patients in Colorado Springs. What he didn't know at that time, was that his career in optometry would be quite different. After seven years of practicing primary care optometry his own vision began to diminish and he was diagnosed with retinitis pigmentosa. This diagnosis changed his perception of vision care and created a passion to provide quality care for others dealing with permanent vision loss. That passion wasn't just about caring for patients, but also to assist other eye care professionals to better understand vision loss and how to move people forward in their lives despite their visual challenges. The Colorado Board of Optometry allowed him to maintain his license with the understanding that he would provide referral based low vision care and no longer provide primary eye care. He created Low Vision Services of Southern Colorado in 1994 to provide care for

patients of all ages dealing with permanent vision loss. Before receiving low vision care, all patients needed to be receiving on-going eye health and refractive care from their optometrist or ophthalmologist. He is very grateful to the Board of Optometry for understanding his passion and trusting him to provide a high level of care to an underserved population. He says, "the Board changed the course of my professional and personal life for the better."



Paul Chous, MA, OD, FAAO

Dr. Paul Chous completed his undergraduate education at Brown and UC Irvine, and then received his Masters and Doctorate of Optometry degrees from UC Berkeley. Paul has a private practice specializing in diabetes eye care and education in Tacoma, WA. He is the author of Diabetic Eye Disease: Lessons From a Diabetic Eye Doctor, which was included in the "Top 12 Diabetes Books" by Diabetes Update magazine in 2004. He is editorial advisor to Review of Optometry and Optometry Times, AOA representative to the National Diabetes Education Program, Primary Investigator for the Diabetes Visual Function Supplement Study (DiVFuSS), and Adjunct Professor of Optometry at Western University of Health Sciences in Pomona, CA. Dr. Chous has had type 1 diabetes since 1968.



Mari Fujimoto, OD, FAAO

Mari Fujimoto earned her Doctor of Optometry degree and completed a residency in Cornea and Contact Lenses at Pacific University College of Optometry in Forest Grove, OR. She is currently a full-time faculty member at Pacific University College of Optometry and is involved in contact lens course and clinical instruction, as well as clinical research.



Paul M. Karpecki, OD, FAAO

Paul M. Karpecki, OD, FAAO, received his Doctor of Optometry degree from Indiana University and completed a fellowship in medical cornea and refractive surgery in Kansas City in affiliation with the Pennsylvania College of Optometry, now Salus University. He currently serves as Clinical Director, Advanced Ocular Surface Disease at Kentucky Eye Institute in Lexington, KY.

Dr. Karpecki was appointed to the Delphi International Society at Wilmer-Johns Hopkins, which included the top 25 dry eye experts in the world and the National Eye Institute's Dry Eye Committee to provide insights around dry eye and women. He also co-chaired the Dry Eye Summit for the profession, was a director in the CJO Optometric Dry Eye Guidelines for EyeCare, was recently

selected for the DEWS II Diagnostic subcommittee and most recently appointed co-chair of the Tear Film and Ocular Surface Society Symposium in 2016 taking place in Montpellier, France. He has over two decades experience in running some of the largest dedicated dry eye clinics in the United States.

A noted educator and author, Dr. Karpecki has provided over 1000 lectures at various meetings covering four continents. He has also authored over 1000 papers in journals, book chapters, clinical eblasts and newsletters.
